4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter Q, Chapter 15, Water Code, is amended
6	by adding Section 15.982 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 15.982. EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. (a) In
8	addition to using the fund for the other purposes authorized by this
9	subchapter, the board may use the fund to provide technical or
10	financial assistance to an eligible political subdivision for a
11	project designed to alleviate a severe water shortage affecting the
12	political subdivision that is caused by an emergency condition such
13	as a drought or public calamity.
14	(b) To be eligible to receive technical or financial
15	assistance under this section, an eligible political subdivision
16	must apply to the board and provide to the board evidence that the
17	political subdivision is affected by a severe water shortage that
18	is caused by an emergency condition such as a drought or public
19	calamity.
20	(c) The board shall expedite review of an application the
21	board receives under this section.
22	(d) The board shall coordinate with the commission, the
23	Department of Agriculture, and any other agency as necessary to
24	implement this section.

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(e) The board may provide technical or financial assistance 1 under this section for a project regardless of whether the project 2 is recommended through the state and regional water planning 3 processes under Sections 16.051 and 16.053. 4 5 SECTION 2. (a) The Texas Water Development Board and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality shall jointly: 6 7 (1)conduct a study regarding: 8 (A) streamlining the application and permitting processes described by Chapters 15, 16, and 17, Water Code, for 9 10 water projects that the Texas Water Development Board has determined are priority projects; and 11 12 (B) the feasibility and desirability of requiring a state agency to: 13 14 (i) compile state and federal permitting 15 requirements applicable to applicants for financial assistance or permits for water projects described by Chapters 15, 16, and 17, 16 17 Water Code; and (ii) provide 18 to the applicants а description or list of the requirements; and 19 (2) conduct a study regarding the effect of the repeal 20 of provisions of the Wagstaff Act, Chapter 128 (S.B. 93), General 21 Laws, Acts of the 42nd Legislature, Regular Session, 1931, and the 22 23 feasibility and desirability of reenacting any of those provisions. 24 (b) The Texas Water Development Board shall submit a report on the results of the studies required by this section to the 25 26 lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of representatives not later than September 1, 2014. 27

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1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
