A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to persons excused from jury service. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 62.113 Texas Government Code, is amended 4 5 by adding subsection (b)(2) to read as follows: 6 (b) On the third business day of each month, the clerk shall 7 send a copy of the list of persons excused or disqualified because of citizenship in the previous month to: 8 (1) the voter registrar of the county; 9 (2) the county election official; 10 11 (23) the secretary of state; and 12 (<u>3</u>4) the county or district attorney, as applicable, for an investigation of whether the person committed an offense 13 14 under Section 13.007, Election Code, Section 64.012, Election Code 15 or other law. SECTION 2. Section 16.031 (a), Texas Election Code, 16 is amended read as follows: 17 18 (a) The registrar shall cancel a voter's registration immediately on receipt of: 19 20 (1) notice under Section 13.072(b) or 15.021 or a 21 response under Section 15.053 that the voter's residence is outside 22 the county; (2) an abstract of the voter's death certificate under 23 24 Section 16.001(a) or an abstract of an application indicating that

1 the voter is deceased under Section 16.001(b);

(3) an abstract of a final judgment of the voter's
total mental incapacity, partial mental incapacity without the
right to vote, conviction of a felony, or disqualification under
Section 16.002, 16.003, or 16.004;

6 (4) notice under Section 112.012 that the voter has 7 applied for a limited ballot in another county;

8 (5) notice from a voter registration official in 9 another state that the voter has registered to vote outside this 10 state;

11 (6) notice from the early voting clerk under Section 12 101.0041 that a federal postcard application submitted by an 13 applicant states a voting residence address located outside the 14 registrar's county; or

15 (7) notice from the secretary of state that the voter 16 has registered to vote in another county, as determined by the 17 voter's driver's license number or personal identification card 18 number issued by the Department of Public Safety or social security 19 number, or.

20 (8) notice from any governmental agency that a voter
 21 has acknowledged that the voter is not citizen of the United States.
 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

23 a vote of two-thirds of all members elected to each house, as 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
