- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 51.605(b) and (c), Government Code, are 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) A clerk shall complete 20 hours of instruction regarding
  8 the performance of the clerk's duties of office <u>before the first</u>
  9 <u>anniversary of the date the clerk assumes those duties</u> [during each
  10 <u>calendar year that begins after the clerk's election or appointment</u>
  11 <u>to office</u>].
- 12 (c) After the first anniversary of the date a clerk assumes

  13 the duties of office, the [A] clerk must each calendar year

  14 complete 20 hours of continuing education courses. [A clerk must,

  15 during the first year of each term of office, complete:
- [(1) at least one hour of continuing education courses
  regarding registry funds handled under Chapter 117, Local
  Sovernment Code, in the performance of the duties of office; and
- [(2) at least one hour of continuing education courses
  regarding fraudulent court documents and fraudulent document
  filings.

  22 SECTION 2. Section 51.605(b), Government Code, as amended
  23 by this Act, applies to a court clerk who assumes the duties of
  24 office on or after the effective date of this Act. A court clerk who

- 1 assumes the duties of office before that date is governed by the law
- 2 in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 3 that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
