5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 33, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 33.089 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 33.089. TRAVEL IMPACT. (a) When assigning a school to
8	a University Interscholastic League classification based on
9	student enrollment, the University Interscholastic League must
10	consider the distance of travel required for school teams to
11	compete against the other schools in the classification and
12	competition district.
13	(b) A school assigned to a University Interscholastic
14	League classification may be reassigned to the next lower
15	classification of schools if:
16	(1) the distance of one-way travel exceeds an average
17	of 200 miles from the school to places of competition; and
18	(2) the student enrollment of the school does not
19	exceed by more than 20 percent the student enrollment maximum for
20	the next lower classification.
21	(c) The University Interscholastic League may assign a
22	school to the lower classification under Subsection (b) only on the
23	request of the school after the University Interscholastic League
24	assignments are made public.

1 (d) To determine if a school qualifies under Subsection (b) 2 for reclassification, the impact of travel is calculated by finding 3 the sum of the one-way mileage from a school to each of the other 4 schools in the school's competition district and dividing the sum 5 by the number of other schools in the competition district.

6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
