- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 531.0995 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 531.0995. NUTRITION AND WELLNESS EDUCATION. (a) This
- 8 section applies to individuals receiving benefits under:
- 9 (1) the financial assistance program under Chapter 31,
- 10 Human Resources Code;
- 11 (2) the medical assistance program under Chapter 32,
- 12 Human Resources Code; or
- 13 (3) the supplemental nutrition assistance program
- 14 under Chapter 33, Human Resources Code.
- 15 (b) The commission shall work with community-based
- 16 organizations to encourage individuals receiving benefits to
- 17 access readily available and existing online information and
- 18 programs, including information provided on the commission's
- 19 website, that provide nutrition and wellness education for the
- 20 purpose of promoting healthy eating habits and a physically active
- 21 lifestyle.
- (c) Not later than January 1, 2015, the commission shall
- 23 report to the legislature on the use of nutrition and wellness
- 24 education information provided on the commission's website. The

- 1 report must include:
- 2 (1) feedback from clients on the effectiveness of the
- 3 <u>information acc</u>essed; and
- 4 (2) any available data on the number of individuals
- 5 who accessed the information.
- 6 (d) The executive commissioner may adopt rules to implement

- 8 <u>(e) This section expires September 1, 2015.</u>
- 9 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 10 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 11 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 12 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 13 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 14 waiver or authorization is granted.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
