A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the use of certain lighting equipment on motor 3 vehicles.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 547.105(b) and (c), Transportation 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:

7 (b) The Texas Department of Transportation may adopt 8 standards and specifications for lighting that permit the use of 9 <u>amber or white</u> flashing lights for identification purposes on 10 highway maintenance and service equipment, including snow-removal 11 equipment.

12 (c) The standards and specifications adopted under this 13 section <u>must comply with</u> [are in lieu of] the standards and 14 specifications otherwise provided by this chapter for lamps on 15 vehicles.

16 SECTION 2. Section 547.305, Transportation Code, is amended 17 by amending Subsections (c), (d), and (e) and adding Subsections 18 (c-1) and (g) to read as follows:

(c) A person may not operate a motor vehicle equipped with a
<u>flashing or alternating light that is</u> red, white, or blue [beacon,
flashing, or alternating light] unless the equipment is:

(1) used as specifically authorized by this chapter;or

1	or turn signal lamp that is used as authorized by law.
2	(c-1) A vehicle may not be equipped or operated with
3	alternately flashing lighting equipment that is blue in color
4	unless the vehicle is:
5	(1) an authorized emergency vehicle that is a police
6	vehicle; or
7	(2) a vehicle used for law enforcement purposes that
8	is owned or leased by the federal government.
9	(d) A vehicle may <u>not</u> be equipped <u>or operated</u> with
10	alternately flashing lighting equipment that is red in color unless
11	[described by Section 547.701 or 547.702 only if] the vehicle is:
12	<pre>(1) a school bus;</pre>
13	(2) an authorized emergency vehicle;
14	(3) a church bus that has the words "church bus"
15	printed on the front and rear of the bus so as to be clearly
16	<u>discernible</u> [discernable] to other vehicle operators; <u>or</u>
17	(4) a tow truck while under the direction of a law
18	enforcement officer at the scene of an accident or while hooking up
19	to a disabled vehicle on a roadway[; or
20	[(5) a tow truck with a mounted light bar which has
21	turn signals and stop lamps in addition to those required by
22	Sections 547.322, 547.323, and 547.324, Transportation Code].
23	(e) A <u>vehicle</u> [person] may not <u>be equipped or operated with</u>
24	alternately flashing lighting equipment that is white in color
25	unless the vehicle is:
26	(1) a vehicle described by Subsection (d); or
27	(2) [operate] highway maintenance or service

1	equipment, including snow-removal equipment[, that is not equipped
2	with lamps or that does not display lighted lamps as required by the
3	standards and specifications adopted by the Texas Department of

5	(g) The lighting conditions authorized by this section are
6	in addition to the lighting requirements under Sections
7	547.321-547.324.
8	SECTION 3. Section 547.305(b), Transportation Code, is
9	repealed.
10	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
