3	program benefits to purchase nutritious foods.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 33, Human Resources Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 33.0252 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 33.0252. PILOT PROGRAM TO ENCOURAGE HEALTHY FOOD
8	CHOICES. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Nutritious food" means a healthy food item
10	approved by the department for the purposes of the pilot program.
11	(2) "Retailer" means a business approved for
12	participation in the supplemental nutrition assistance program.
13	(b) The department shall establish a pilot program under
14	which:
15	(1) a recipient of supplemental nutrition assistance
16	program benefits receives additional benefits at the point of sale
17	toward future purchases if the recipient purchases a nutritious
18	food; and
19	(2) a retailer is authorized to promote to a recipient
20	of supplemental nutrition assistance program benefits that the
21	recipient may receive additional benefits as a result of nutritious
22	food purchases under the pilot program.
23	(c) The executive commissioner may adopt rules as necessary
24	to implement the pilot program. Rules adopted under this section

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1 <u>must include a list of nutritious foods approved for purposes of the</u> 2 <u>pilot program.</u>

3 (d) Not later than September 1 of each year, the department 4 shall submit a report to the legislature regarding the pilot 5 program. The report must include an analysis of whether the 6 additional benefits provided under the program have resulted in 7 increased use of supplemental nutrition assistance program 8 benefits on nutritious food purchases.

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(e) This section expires September 1, 2018.

SECTION 2. As soon as possible after the effective date of 10 this Act, the Health and Human Services Commission shall apply for 11 actively pursue from the United States Department 12 and of Agriculture Food and Nutrition Service or other appropriate federal 13 agency any waiver or other authorization necessary to implement 14 15 this Act. The commission may delay implementing this Act until the waiver or authorization is granted. 16

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
