9	one of the following forms of photo identification:
10	(1) a driver's license, election identification
11	certificate, or personal identification card issued to the person
12	by the Department of Public Safety that has not expired or that
13	expired no earlier than 60 days before the date of presentation;
14	(2) a United States military identification card that
15	contains the person's photograph that has not expired or that
16	expired no earlier than 60 days before the date of presentation;
17	(3) a United States citizenship certificate issued to
18	the person that contains the person's photograph;
19	(4) a United States passport issued to the person that
20	has not expired or that expired no earlier than 60 days before the
21	date of presentation; or
22	(5) a license to carry a concealed handgun issued to
23	the person by the Department of Public Safety that has not expired
24	or that expired no earlier than 60 days before the date of

2 (b) A county clerk may require that a person presenting a 3 document in person for filing must present a photo identification 4 to the clerk. The clerk may copy the photo identification or record 5 information from the photo identification.

6 (c) Information copied or recorded from the photo 7 identification is confidential and may not be released to any 8 person.

9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
