## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 3 providing criminal penalties; authorizing a fee.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 1956, Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 1956.06125 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1956.06125. REGISTRATION WITH COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY.
- 8 A county or municipality may:
- 9 <u>(1) require a person to obtain a license or permit from</u>
- 10 the county or municipality before the person engages in the
- 11 business of purchasing and selling crafted precious metal in that
- 12 county or municipality; and
- 13 (2) impose a fee for the issuance or renewal of the
- 14 license or permit.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 1956.062, Occupations Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 1956.062. RECORD [REPORT] OF PURCHASE OR EXCHANGE
- 18 REQUIRED. (a) A dealer shall maintain an accurate record of [, as
- 19 required by Section 1956.063, report all identifiable crafted
- 20 precious metal that the dealer purchases, takes in trade, accepts
- 21 for sale on consignment, or accepts for auction.
- 22 (b) The record [Before crafted precious metal is offered for
- 23 sale or exchange, a dealer must notify each person intending to sell
- 24 or exchange the metal that, before the dealer may accept any of the

person's property, the person must file with the dealer a list 1 describing all of the person's crafted precious metal to be 2 accepted by the dealer. The list] must include [contain]: 3 (1)the date of the transaction; 4 5 (2) the name and physical address of the dealer; (3) the [proposed] seller's name as listed on the 6 seller's personal identification document; 7 (4) the identifying number of the seller's personal 8 identification document; 9 10 (5) the physical [and] address at which the seller is residing at the time of the transaction; 11 12 (6) the seller's sex, height, date of birth, and eye 13 color; 14 (7) a digital or video photograph that accurately 15 depicts the seller; (8) a clean and legible thumbprint of the seller; 16 (9)  $[\frac{(2)}{(2)}]$  a complete and accurate description of the 17 crafted precious metal that includes: 18 19 (A) the number of items accepted; 20 (B) for each item accepted, the size, weight, and length of the item, and the material from which the item is made; 21 (C) for each item accepted that contains a 22 precious metal, the color, weight, purity, and type of each 23 24 precious metal; 25 (D) the color, number, size, and approximate 26 weight of any stone included in the items accepted; and

(E) other identifying characteristics of the

- 2 (10) the total amount paid by the dealer to the seller,
- 3 including the amounts attributable to each type of precious metal
- 4 accepted;
- 5 (11) a digital or video photograph that accurately
- 6 depicts each item accepted; and
- 7  $\underline{(12)}$  [ $\overline{(3)}$ ] the [ $\overline{proposed}$ ] seller's certification
- 8 that:
- 9 <u>(A)</u> the information <u>in the record</u> is true and
- 10 complete; and
- 11 (B) the seller is the legal owner of or is
- 12 lawfully entitled to transfer the crafted precious metal.
- 13 (c) [The dealer shall record the proposed seller's driver's
- 14 license number or department personal identification certificate
- 15 number on physical presentation of the license or personal
- 16 identification certificate by the seller. The record must
- 17 accompany the list.
- 18  $\left[\frac{\text{(d)}}{\text{)}}\right]$  The dealer shall:
- 19 (1) provide to a peace officer, on demand, the record
- 20 [list] required by this section [Subsection (b)]; and
- 21 (2) <u>except as provided by Subsection (d)</u>, mail or
- 22 deliver a complete copy of the  $\underline{record}$  [list] to the chief of police
- 23 or the sheriff as provided by Section 1956.063 not later than 24
- 24 [48] hours after the time the transaction occurs [list is filed with
- 25 the dealer].
- 26 (d) The chief of police or the sheriff may require the
- 27 electronic submission through an Internet website of a record under

- 1 Subsection (c)(2).
- 2 (e) In this section, "seller" includes a transferor who
- 3 exchanges, or offers to exchange, crafted precious metal with a
- 4 dealer.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 1956.063(c), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) For each transaction for which the dealer is required by
- 8 Section 1956.062 to maintain a record [regulated by this
- 9 subchapter], the dealer shall submit a report on a preprinted and
- 10 prenumbered form prescribed by the commissioner. The form must
- 11 include the <u>information required to be included in the record</u>
- 12 [following:
- 13 [(1) the date of the transaction;
- 14 [(2) a description of the crafted precious metal
- 15 purchased by the dealer;
- 16 [(3) the name and physical address of the dealer; and
- 17 [(4) the name, physical description, and physical
- 18 address of the seller or transferor].
- 19 SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 1956, Occupations Code, is
- 20 amended by adding Section 1956.0631 to read as follows:
- 21 Sec. 1956.0631. PAYMENT FOR CRAFTED PRECIOUS METAL
- 22 PURCHASED. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a dealer may
- 23 pay for a purchase of crafted precious metal only by check.
- 24 (b) A dealer may pay for a purchase of crafted precious
- 25 metal in cash only if:
- 26 (1) the purchase occurs in a jurisdiction in which the
- 27 dealer is permitted to electronically submit the record of the

- 1 purchase through an Internet website under Section 1956.062(d); and
- 2 (2) the dealer submits the record for that purchase
- 3 electronically.
- 4 SECTION 5. Section 1956.064(a), Occupations Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) A dealer may not melt, deface, alter, or dispose of
- 7 crafted precious metal that is the subject of a report required by
- 8 this subchapter before the 21st [11th] day after the date the report
- 9 is filed unless:
- 10 (1) the peace officer to whom the report is submitted,
- 11 for good cause, authorizes disposition of the metal; or
- 12 (2) [the dealer obtains the name, address, and
- 13 description of the buyer and retains a record of that information;
- 14 <del>or</del>
- 15  $\left[\frac{(3)}{3}\right]$  the dealer is a pawnbroker and the disposition
- 16 is the redemption of pledged property by the pledgor.
- 17 SECTION 6. Section 1956.066, Occupations Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 1956.066. PURCHASE FROM MINOR PROHIBITED. [<del>(a)</del>] A
- 20 dealer may not purchase crafted precious metal from a person
- 21 younger than 18 years of age [unless the seller delivers to the
- 22 dealer before the purchase a written statement from the seller's
- 23 parent or legal guardian consenting to the transaction].
- 24 [(b) The dealer shall retain the statement with the records
- 25 required to be kept under this subchapter. The dealer may destroy
- 26 the statement after the later of:
- 27 [(1) the date the item is sold; or

- 1 [(2) the first anniversary of the date the dealer
- 2 purchased the item.
- 3 SECTION 7. Section 1956.067(b), Occupations Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 (b) The registration statement must contain:
- 6 (1) the name and address of the dealer;
- 7 (2) the location where business is to be conducted;
- 8 (3) the location where the precious metal or used
- 9 items made of precious metal will be held after the purchase;
- 10  $\underline{(4)}$  if the dealer is an association, the name and
- 11 address of each member of the association;
- 12 (5)  $[\frac{4}{1}]$  if the dealer is a corporation, the name and
- 13 address of each officer and director of the corporation; and
- 14  $\underline{(6)}$  [ $\overline{(5)}$ ] other relevant information required by the
- 15 department.
- SECTION 8. Subchapter B, Chapter 1956, Occupations Code, is
- 17 amended by adding Section 1956.0681 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 1956.0681. PURCHASE OF DEFACED, ALTERED, OR BROKEN
- 19 ITEMS. A dealer, in the course of business, may not purchase from a
- 20 person other than a manufacturer of or a regular dealer in crafted
- 21 precious metal an object that has been defaced, altered, or broken
- 22 to the extent that the object cannot be used for its original
- 23 purpose without substantial repair.
- SECTION 9. Section 1956.069, Occupations Code, is amended
- 25 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1956.069. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person commits an
- 27 offense if the person:

- 10 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
- 11 (b) Sections 1956.063(c) and 1956.069, Occupations Code, as
- 12 amended by this Act, take effect December 1, 2013.
