- 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 421, Government Code, is amended by 7 adding Subchapter G to read as follows:

- 9 Sec. 421.101. POLICY; VIOLATION OF SUBCHAPTER. (a) It is
- 10 the policy of this state to refuse to provide material support for
- 11 or to participate in any federal order, law, policy, rule, mandate,
- or agency regulation that the Texas Legislature, by a vote of 2/3 of
- 13 the members of each body determine would violate Article I of the
- 14 Texas Constitution.
- 15 (b) a state agency, public official, employee, or political
- 16 subdivision of this state may not act to impose, collect, enforce,
- 17 implement or effectuate a provision, penalty, or sanction
- 18 determined to be unconstitutional under subsection (a).
- 19 (c) For purposes of this section, "provision, penalty, or
- 20 sanction" includes any civil or criminal fine or penalty,
- 21 administrative penalty, license suspension or revocation,
- 22 suspension or revocation of the authority to engage in business in
- 23 this state, tax, salary or wage withholding or garnishment,
- 24 surcharge, or fee, or any other action or consequence implemented

- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
