[The members of the commission must approve 10 11 the course materials, training curriculum, and examinations before 12 the commission may distribute the materials and administer examinations.] 13 14 (e) The commission shall: (1) maintain course materials and examinations in a 15 16 central location and provide county service offices and commission field staff with access to the course materials on the commission's 17 Internet website; 18 (2) regularly update course materials, training 19 20 curriculum, and examinations after consulting with: 21 (A) the United States Department of Veterans 22 Affairs to ensure the course materials, training curriculum, and 23 examinations are accurate and meet applicable United States

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Department of Veterans Affairs requirements; and

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(B) accredited county service officers to ensure
 the materials, training curriculum, and examinations include
 issues developing at the county level; [and]

4 (3) develop a training handbook containing 5 instruction and case studies addressing:

(A) general assistance techniques, including how
to provide general information regarding state and federal benefits
and referrals for other services and to other agencies, and general
information regarding state and federal benefits;

(B) basic counseling approaches for assisting
veterans, their family members, and other eligible dependents
filing benefit claims;

13 (C) basic information on United States 14 Department of Veterans Affairs processes and procedures, including 15 how to accurately complete claims and appeals forms and how to 16 support claims;

17 (D) methods of collecting required documentation18 and developing claims and appeals;

19 (E) methods of documenting progress and updating
20 a veteran's, a veteran's family member's, or another eligible
21 dependent's case information;

(F) methods of assisting veterans, their family members, or other eligible dependents in pursuing appeals, including offering case knowledge in appeals hearings; and
