24	(c) Subsection (b)(4) does not prohibit the department from

<u>license holder in an advertisement for a structural pest control</u>

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
