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AN ACT

2 relating to the requirements for obtaining a health science 3 technology education teaching certificate and to the scope of 4 courses a person may teach holding a technology applications 5 teaching certificate.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 21.044, Education Code, as amended by Chapters 635 (S.B. 866) and 926 (S.B. 1620), Acts of the 82nd Legislature, Regular Session, 2011, is reenacted and amended to read as follows:

11 Sec. 21.044. EDUCATOR PREPARATION. (a) The board shall 12 propose rules establishing the training requirements a person must 13 accomplish to obtain a certificate, enter an internship, or enter 14 an induction-year program. The board shall specify the minimum 15 academic qualifications required for a certificate.

(b) Any minimum academic qualifications for a certificate specified under Subsection (a) that require a person to possess a bachelor's degree must also require that the person receive, as part of the curriculum for that degree, instruction in detection and education of students with dyslexia. This subsection does not apply to a person who obtains a certificate through an alternative certification program adopted under Section 21.049.

23 (c) The instruction under Subsection (b) must:

24 (1) be developed by a panel of experts in the diagnosis

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1 and treatment of dyslexia who are: 2 (A) employed institutions higher by of 3 education; and 4 (B) approved by the board; and 5 (2) include information on: (A) characteristics of dyslexia; 6 7 (B) identification of dyslexia; and 8 (C) effective, multisensory strategies for teaching students with dyslexia. 9 (d) [(b)] In proposing rules under this section, the board 10 shall specify that to obtain a certificate to teach an "applied STEM 11 12 course," as that term is defined by Section 28.027, at a secondary school, a person must: 13 14 (1)pass the certification test administered by the recognized national or international business and industry group 15 that created the curriculum the applied STEM course is based on; and 16 17 (2) have at a minimum: 18 (A) an associate degree from an accredited 19 institution of higher education; and 20 three years of work experience (B) in an 21 occupation for which the applied STEM course is intended to prepare 22 the student. (e) In proposing rules under this section for a person to 23 24 obtain a certificate to teach a health science technology education course, the board shall specify that a person must have: 25 26 (1) an associate degree or more advanced degree from 27 an accredited institution of higher education;

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H.B. No. 3573 (2) current licensure, certification, or registration 1 as a health professions practitioner issued by a nationally 2 recognized accrediting agency for health professionals; and 3 4 (3) at least two years of wage earning experience 5 utilizing the licensure requirement. 6 (f) The board may not propose rules for a certificate to 7 teach a health science technology education course that specify 8 that a person must have a bachelor's degree or that establish any other credential or teaching experience requirements that exceed 9 the requirements under Subsection (e). 10 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is 11 12 amended by adding Section 21.0486 to read as follows: Sec. 21.0486. TECHNOLOGY APPLICATIONS CERTIFICATION. A 13 14 person who holds a technology applications certificate issued under 15 this subchapter may, in addition to teaching technology applications courses as authorized under the certificate, teach 16 17 courses in: 18 (1) principles of arts, audio/video technology, and 19 communications; and (2) principles of information technology. 20 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 23 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013. 25
