H.B. No. 3590

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the authority of a customer to choose not to have an

- 3 advanced meter on the customer's property.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.107, Utilities Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsections (k) and (l) to read as follows:
- 7 (k) An electric utility or transmission and distribution
- 8 utility that receives from the commission approval of the utility's
- 9 plan for deploying advanced meters shall send by mail to each
- 10 customer scheduled to receive an advanced meter under the plan a
- 11 notice to inform the customer that the customer may decline to have
- 12 the meter installed and of the manner in which the customer may
- 13 <u>decline installation</u>. If the utility includes the notice with the
- 14 customer's bill, the utility must print the notice on a separate
- 15 page. If, not later than the 30th day after the date the customer
- 16 receives the notice, the customer declines to have the advanced
- 17 meter installed, the utility:
- 18 <u>(1) may not install the meter; and</u>
- 19 (2) may not charge the customer the nonbypassable
- 20 <u>surcharge otherwise authorized by Subsection (h).</u>
- 21 (1) An electric utility or transmission and distribution
- 22 utility that has deployed advanced meters under a plan approved by
- 23 the commission shall send by mail to each customer that is using an
- 24 installed advanced meter a notice to inform the customer that the

- 1 customer may choose to have the meter removed and replaced with a
- 2 conventional meter and of the manner in which the customer may
- 3 choose removal and replacement. If the utility includes the notice
- 4 with the customer's bill, the utility must print the notice on a
- 5 separate page. If the customer chooses to remove the advanced
- 6 meter, the utility:
- 7 (1) must remove the advanced meter; and
- 8 (2) may not charge the customer the nonbypassable
 9 surcharge described by Subsection (h).
- 10 SECTION 2. (a) This section applies only to an electric
- 11 utility or transmission and distribution utility that, before the
- 12 effective date of this Act, received approval from the Public
- 13 Utility Commission of Texas of the utility's plan for deploying
- 14 advanced meters but that has not completed that deployment on the
- 15 effective date of this Act.
- 16 (b) An electric utility or transmission and distribution
- 17 utility shall suspend the deployment of advanced meters for not
- 18 less than 45 days beginning on the effective date of this Act.
- 19 (c) Not later than the 15th day after the effective date of
- 20 this Act, an electric utility or transmission and distribution
- 21 utility shall send the notice required by Section 39.107(k),
- 22 Utilities Code, as added by this Act, to each customer who is
- 23 scheduled to receive an advanced meter under the deployment plan
- 24 but has not received the meter. If a customer declines installation
- 25 of the meter in the manner provided by the notice, the utility shall
- 26 refund to the customer the amount of any nonbypassable surcharge
- 27 imposed under Section 39.107(h), Utilities Code, that the utility

- 1 previously collected from the customer.
- 2 (d) Not later than the 15th day after the effective date of
- 3 this Act, the electric utility or transmission and distribution
- 4 utility shall send the notice required by Section 39.107(1),
- 5 Utilities Code, as added by this Act, to each customer who has
- 6 received an advanced meter under the deployment plan.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
