## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the evaluation by the Texas Water Development Board of
- 3 applications for financial assistance for certain retail public

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 17, Water Code, is amended
- 7 by adding Section 17.1245 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 17.1245. EVALUATION AND MODIFICATION OF CERTAIN
- 9 APPLICATIONS. (a) In passing on an application for financial
- 10 assistance from a retail public utility that provides potable water
- 11 <u>service to 3,300 or more connections, the board shall:</u>
- 12 (1) evaluate the utility's system water loss based on
- 13 the most recent audit prepared under Section 16.0121;
- 14 (2) evaluate for compliance with the board's best
- 15 management practices the utility's water conservation plan
- 16 required under Section 13.146; and
- 17 (3) issue a report to the utility detailing the
- 18 results of the evaluation conducted under Subdivision (2).
- 19 (b) Not later than January 1 of each odd-numbered year, the
- 20 board shall submit to the legislature a written summary of the
- 21 results of evaluations conducted under Subsection (a)(2).
- 22 <u>(c) If an evaluation conducted under Subsection (a)(1)</u>
- 23 indicates that a utility's system water loss exceeds 15 percent
- 24 annually, the board:

- 1 (1) shall require the utility to amend the utility's
- 2 application for financial assistance to include a plan to reduce
- 3 the utility's system water loss to less than 15 percent annually;
- 4 and
- 5 (2) may require that a portion of financial assistance
- 6 <u>awarded under this chapter be used to mitigate the system water loss</u>
- 7 or award additional financial assistance for that purpose.
- 8 (d) The board, by a two-thirds vote, may exempt from the
- 9 application of Subsection (c) a utility whose system water loss
- 10 exceeds 15 percent.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 17.1245, Water Code, as added by this
- 12 Act, applies only to an application for financial assistance
- 13 submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 14 application for financial assistance submitted before the
- 15 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 16 date the application was submitted, and the former law is continued
- 17 in effect for that purpose.
- 18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
