PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION CERTIFICATE ISSUED 8 TO [EXPIRATION AND RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS FOR] CERTAIN SEX OFFENDERS. 9 The department may issue an original or renewal personal 10 (a) identification certificate to a person whose driver's license or 11 12 personal identification certificate record indicates that the person is subject to the registration requirements of Chapter 62, 13 14 Code of Criminal Procedure, only if the person: 15 (1) applies in person for the issuance of а certificate under this section; and 16 17 (2) pays a fee of \$20. 18 (b) [A personal identification certificate issued under this section, including a renewal, duplicate, or corrected 19 certificate, expires on the first birthday of the certificate 20 21 holder occurring after the date of application, except that the initial certificate issued under this section expires on the second 22 23 birthday of the certificate holder occurring after the date of 24 application.

4 SECTION 2. Section 522.051(a), Transportation Code, is 5 amended to read as follows:

SECTION 3. The following laws are repealed:

11 (1) Article 62.060(b), Code of Criminal Procedure; 12 (2) Sections 521.272(c) and (d), Transportation Code; 13 and

(3) Section 522.033(b), Transportation Code.

15 SECTION 4. The repeal by this Act of Article 62.060(b), Code of Criminal Procedure, does not apply to an offense committed under 16 17 that subsection before the effective date of the repeal. An offense committed before the effective date of the repeal is governed by 18 that subsection as it existed on the date the offense was committed, 19 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For 20 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the 21 effective date of the repeal if any element of the offense occurred 22 before that date. 23

SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections 521.103, 521.272, 522.033, and 522.051, Transportation Code, apply only to a driver's license, personal identification certificate, commercial driver's license, or commercial driver learner's permit

1 issued or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. A 2 driver's license, personal identification certificate, commercial 3 driver's license, or commercial driver learner's permit issued or 4 renewed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law 5 in effect when the license, certificate, or permit was issued, and 6 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

7 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
