A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the duties of the Council on Children and Families.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 531.803(a), Government Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (a) The council shall:
- 7 (1) analyze the biennial legislative appropriations
- 8 requests of members of the council for services provided to
- 9 children and their families and identify appropriations that,
- 10 through the coordination of members of the council, could be
- 11 modified in the next legislative appropriation request to eliminate
- 12 waste or increase available services and, not later than May 1 of
- 13 each even-numbered year, prepare a report recommending those
- 14 modifications for consideration during the development of the next
- 15 biennial legislative appropriations request;
- 16 (2) investigate opportunities to increase flexible
- 17 funding for health, education, and human services provided to
- 18 children and their families;
- 19 (3) identify methods to remove barriers to local
- 20 coordination of health, education, and human services provided to
- 21 children and their families;
- 22 (4) identify methods to ensure that children and youth
- 23 receive appropriate assessment, diagnoses, and intervention
- 24 services;

- 1 (5) develop methods to prevent unnecessary parental
- 2 relinquishment of custody of children;
- 3 (6) prioritize assisting children in family settings
- 4 rather than institutional settings;
- 5 (7) make recommendations about family involvement in
- 6 the provision and planning of health, education, and human services
- 7 for a child, including family partner and liaison models; [and]
- 8 (8) identify technological methods to ensure the
- 9 efficient and timely transfer of information among state agencies
- 10 providing health, education, and human services to children and
- 11 their families; and
- 12 (9) coordinate interagency grant or resource
- 13 <u>development efforts to improve efficiencies and outcomes for</u>
- 14 <u>children and families, including possible dedication of staff to:</u>
- 15 (A) assist individual health, education, human
- 16 services, juvenile justice, and workforce agencies to write or
- 17 develop interagency grants and coordinate resources;
- 18 (B) coordinate or lead interagency grant or
- 19 resource development efforts; and
- 20 (C) assist the council to facilitate interagency
- 21 resource and policy coordination.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
