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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the provision of and funding for certain primary health care services. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subdivisions (1), (3), and (4), Subsection (a), 5 Section 31.002, Health and Safety Code, are amended to read as 6 7 follows: "Facility" includes an entity providing primary [a 8 (1) hospital, ambulatory surgical center, public health clinic, 9 birthing center, outpatient clinic, and community] health care 10 services [center]. 11 12 (3) "Other benefit" means a benefit, other than a benefit provided under this chapter, to which an individual is 13 14 entitled for payment of the costs of primary health care services, including benefits available from: 15 16 (A) an insurance policy, group health plan, or 17 prepaid medical care plan; 18 (B) Title XVIII, [or] XIX, or XXI of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section 1395 et seq., [or] Section 1396 et 19 seq., or Section 1397aa et seq.); 20 21 (C) [the Veterans Administration; 22 [(D) the Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Uniformed Services; 23 [(E) workers' compensation 24 or anv other

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compulsory employers' insurance program; 1 [(F)] a public program created by federal or 2 3 state law, or by an ordinance or rule of a municipality or political subdivision of the state, excluding benefits created by the 4 5 establishment of a municipal or county hospital, a joint municipal-county hospital, a county hospital authority, a hospital 6 district, or the facilities of a publicly supported medical school; 7 8 or 9 [(G) a cause of action for medical, facility, or 10 medical transportation expenses, or a settlement or judgment based on the cause of action, if the expenses are related to the need for 11 12 services provided under this chapter]. 13 (4) "Primary health care services" may include 14 [includes]: 15 (A) a health service related to family, internal, pediatric, obstetric, or gynecological medicine that is provided by 16 17 a physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse [diagnosis and treatment]; 18 19 (B) diagnostic laboratory and radiological 20 services; 21 (C) emergency medical services; 22 (D) [(C)] family planning services; 23 (E) [(D)] preventive health services, including: 24 (i) prenatal and perinatal services; (ii) appropriate cancer screening; 25 26 (iii) well-child services; immunizations against diseases that 27 (iv)

1 are preventable by vaccines; (v) screenings for elevated blood levels, 2 communicable diseases, and cholesterol levels; 3 4 (vi) pediatric eye, ear, and dental 5 screenings to determine the need for vision and hearing correction and dental care; and 6 7 (vii) preventive dental services; 8 (F) [(E)] health education; 9 [(F) laboratory, X-ray, nuclear medicine, 10 other appropriate diagnostic services; [(C) nutrition services; 11 [(H) health screening; 12 [(I) home health care; 13 14 [(J) dental care; 15 [(K) transportation;] (G) [(L)] prescription drugs and devices and 16 17 durable supplies, as appropriate; and (H) integrated mental health services 18 [(M) environmental health services; 19 [(N) podiatry services; and 20 [(0) social services]. 21 SECTION 2. Subsections (c), (d), (e), (f), and (g), Section 22 31.003, Health and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows: 23 24 (c) If budgetary limitations exist, the department [board by rule] shall establish a system of priorities relating to the 25 26 types of services provided [, geographic areas covered,] or [classes of] individuals eligible for services. 27

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(d) The <u>department</u> [board] shall adopt rules under
Subsection (c) relating to the <u>services provided</u> [geographic areas
covered] and the [classes of] individuals eligible for services
[according to a statewide determination of the need for services].

5 (e) The <u>department</u> [board] shall adopt rules under 6 Subsection (c) relating to the types of services provided according 7 to the set of service priorities established under this subsection. 8 Initial service priorities shall focus on the funding of, provision 9 of, and access to:

10 (1) <u>health services related to family, internal,</u> 11 <u>pediatric, obstetric, or gynecological medicine that is provided by</u> 12 <u>a physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered</u> 13 nurse [diagnosis and treatment];

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(2) emergency <u>medical</u> services;

(3) family planning services;

16 (4) preventive health services, including 17 immunizations;

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(5) health education; and

19 (6) laboratory, X-ray, [nuclear medicine,] or other
20 appropriate diagnostic services.

(f) Except as limited by this section, the department shall develop an integrated framework for the equitable provision of services throughout the state and shall use existing public and private health[, transportation, and education] resources.

25 (g) The <u>department shall ensure that contractors have made</u>, 26 <u>will make</u>, and will continue to make every reasonable effort to 27 <u>collect appropriate reimbursement for its costs in providing</u>

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primary health care services to persons who are entitled to receive 1 other benefits the [board should require that the services provided 2 under this chapter be reserved to the greatest extent possible for 3 4 low-income individuals who are not eligible for similar services 5 through any other publicly funded program]. 6 SECTION 3. Subsection (a), Section 31.012, Health and 7 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 8 (a) The <u>department</u> [board] may <u>authorize</u> [charge fees for the services provided directly by the department or through] 9 approved providers to charge a copayment for services provided in 10 accordance with Subchapter D, Chapter 12. 11

12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
