Section 39.916(a), Utilities Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 39.916. INTERCONNECTION OF DISTRIBUTED 7 RENEWABLE GENERATION. (a) In this section: 8 (1) "Distributed renewable generation" means electric 9 generation [with a capacity of not more than 2,000 kilowatts] 10 provided by a renewable energy technology, as defined by Section 11 12 39.904,<u>:</u> 13 (A) with a capacity of not more than 2,000 14 kilowatts that is installed on a retail electric customer's side of 15 the meter; or (B) with a capacity of not more than 10 megawatts 16 that is installed on a retail electric customer's side of the meter 17 and on land or buildings owned by the United States, or on land or 18 buildings owned by this state or a political subdivision of this 19 20 state. 21 (2) "Distributed renewable generation owner" means: 22 of distributed (A) an owner renewable 23 generation; a retail electric customer on whose side of 24 (B)

1 the meter distributed renewable generation is installed and 2 operated, regardless of whether the customer takes ownership of the 3 distributed renewable generation; or

4 (C) a person who by contract is assigned 5 ownership rights to energy produced from distributed renewable 6 generation located at the premises of the customer on the 7 customer's side of the meter.

8 (3) "Interconnection" means the right of a distributed 9 renewable generation owner to physically connect distributed 10 renewable generation to an electricity distribution system, and the 11 technical requirements, rules, or processes for the connection.

12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
