1 AN ACT 2 relating to creation of the Health Freedom Act. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subtitle G, Title 8, Insurance Code, is amended 4 5 by adding Chapter 1510 to read as follows: 6 CHAPTER 1510. HEALTH FREEDOM ACT Sec. 1510.001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as 7 the Health Freedom Act. 8 Sec. 1510.002. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "penalty or 9 sanction" includes any civil or criminal fine, administrative 10 penalty, license suspension or revocation, suspension or 11 revocation of the authority to engage in business in this state, 12 tax, salary or wage withholding or garnishment, surcharge, or fee, 13 14 or any other consequence imposed to punish or discourage the exercise of rights protected under this chapter. 15 Sec. 1510.003. STATEMENT OF PUBLIC POLICY; CONSTRUCTION 16 WITH OTHER LAW. (a) Consistent with the constitutionally 17 recognized and inalienable rights of liberty, the public policy of 18 this state is that each individual in this state has the right to 19 choose or decline to choose health insurance coverage without 20 penalty or sanction or threat of penalty or sanction. 21 (b) This section may not be construed to impair any right of 22 23 contract related to the provision of health insurance coverage to

24 an individual or group, or the establishment or enforcement of a

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1	court or administrative order for medical support of a child.
2	Sec. 1510.004. ENFORCEMENT. (a) An agency, public officer
3	or employee, or political subdivision of this state may not act to
4	impose, collect, enforce, or effectuate a penalty or sanction that
5	violates the public policy described by Section 1510.003(a).
6	(b) The attorney general shall take all necessary action
7	authorized by Section 402.038, Government Code, to preserve the
8	rights described by Section 1510.003(a).
9	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 402, Government Code, is
10	amended by adding Section 402.038 to read as follows:
11	Sec. 402.038. ENFORCEMENT OF HEALTH FREEDOM ACT. If a law
12	or rule or regulation that violates the public policy described by
13	Section 1510.003(a), Insurance Code, is enacted or adopted by any
14	governmental entity, including the federal government, a political
15	subdivision of this state, or a state or federal agency, the
16	attorney general shall take all necessary action to preserve the
17	rights described by Section 1510.003(a), Insurance Code,
18	including:
19	(1) seeking injunctive relief; and
20	(2) defending this state and state officers,
21	employees, and agencies.
22	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
23	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
24	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
25	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
26	Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
