## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the guidelines for animal shelters.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 823.001(4), Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (4) "Department" means the [Texas] Department of State
- 7 Health <u>Services</u>.
- 8 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 823.003, Health and
- 9 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 823.003. STANDARDS AND REGULATIONS FOR ANIMAL
- 11 SHELTERS; CRIMINAL PENALTY.
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 823.003, Health and Safety Code, is
- 13 amended by adding Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsection (e) to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (e) Each person operating an animal shelter shall set as a
- 16 goal for the shelter to release all healthy animals in its custody.
- 17 The <u>department</u> [board] may require each person operating an animal
- 18 shelter to keep records of the date and disposition of animals in
- 19 its custody, to maintain the records on the business premises of the
- 20 animal shelter, and to make the records available for inspection at
- 21 reasonable times.
- SECTION 4. Chapter 823, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 23 by adding Section 823.004 to read as follows:
- Sec. 823.004. LIVE RELEASE DATABASE. Each animal shelter

- 1 operated in this state shall consider establishing and maintaining
- 2 a live release database to track the number of animals in the
- 3 shelter and the number of live releases from that shelter using the
- 4 statistics table and live release rate formulas developed by the
- 5 Asilomar Accords and in effect on January 1, 2013, or a successor
- 6 table or formula.
- 7 SECTION 5. Section 823.005(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (b) The advisory committee must be composed of at least one
- 10 licensed veterinarian, one county or municipal official, one person
- 11 whose duties include the daily operation of an animal shelter, one
- 12 representative from a rescue organization or a local private animal
- 13 shelter, and one representative from an animal welfare
- 14 organization.
- SECTION 6. Chapter 823, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 16 by adding Section 823.006 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 823.006. FOSTER PROGRAMS. (a) Each animal shelter
- 18 operated in this state shall consider establishing and operating a
- 19 foster program that is approved by an advisory committee described
- 20 by Section 823.005.
- 21 (b) The foster program may include:
- 22 (1) a recruitment plan for attracting volunteers and
- 23 participants of the foster program;
- 24 (2) adoption events in the county or municipality in
- 25 which the shelter is located; and
- 26 (3) a partnership with local private animal shelters
- 27 to further the purposes of the program and for the transfer of

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- 1 healthy animals to relieve excess population of the shelter.
- 2 (c) The animal shelter shall consider ensuring that each
- 3 animal in the foster program that weighs more than five pounds is
- 4 vaccinated and spayed or neutered, as applicable.
- 5 SECTION 7. Section 823.001(2), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 repealed.
- 7 SECTION 8. The Department of State Health Services shall
- 8 implement Section 823.004, Health and Safety Code, as added by this
- 9 Act, not later than January 1, 2014.
- SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
