## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the insanity defense in a criminal case.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 8.01(a), Penal Code, is amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (a) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution that, at the
- 7 time of the conduct charged, the actor, as a result of severe mental
- 8 disease or defect, did not <a href="mailto:appreciate"><u>appreciate</u></a> [know] that <a href="mailto:the actor's">the actor's</a> [his]
- 9 conduct was either legally or morally wrong.
- 10 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act in amending
- 11 Section 8.01(a), Penal Code, applies only to a defendant acquitted
- 12 of an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 13 A defendant acquitted of an offense committed before the effective
- 14 date of this Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was
- 15 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 16 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed
- 17 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 18 occurred before that date.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
