7	Code, is amended by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection
8	(f) to read as follows:
9	(d) Except as provided by <u>Subsections</u> [Subsection] (e) <u>and</u>
10	(f), an unsworn declaration made under this section must include a
11	jurat in substantially the following form:
12	"My name is, my
13	(First) (Middle) (Last)
14	date of birth is, and my address is

17	and I declare under penalty of

19	perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.

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1	(f) An unsworn declaration made under this section by an
2	employee of a state agency or a political subdivision in the
3	performance of the employee's job duties, must include a jurat in
4	substantially the following form:
5	"My name is

7	and I am an employee of the following governmental
8	agency: I am executing this
9	declaration as part of my assigned duties and
10	responsibilities. I declare under penalty of perjury
11	that the foregoing is true and correct.

17	SECTION 2. Section 132.001(f), Civil Practice and Remedies
18	Code, as added by this Act, applies only to an unsworn declaration
19	executed on or after the effective date of this Act. An unsworn
20	declaration executed before the effective date of this Act is
21	governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
22	of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
23	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
