A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the dissolution of the Lipan Creek Flood Control 3 District. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. On the effective date of this Act: (1) the Lipan Creek Flood Control District 6 is 7 dissolved; (2) the terms of the directors of the district expire; 8 9 and any assets of the district, including any tax or 10 (3) 11 assessment revenue, that remain after payment of the district's 12 liabilities are transferred to Concho and Tom Green Counties, in the proportion that the area of each county located in the territory 13 14 of the district bears to the total area of the district. SECTION 2. The following laws are repealed: 15 16 (1) Chapter 628, Acts of the 59th Legislature, Regular Session, 1965; and 17 18 (2) Chapter 473, Acts of the 67th Legislature, Regular Session, 1981. 19 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to 20 21 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a 22 23 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished 24

under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
Government Code.

3 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has 4 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on 5 Environmental Quality.

6 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed 7 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the 8 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of 9 representatives within the required time.

10 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this 11 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect 12 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled 13 and accomplished.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
