1 AN ACT 2 relating to the transfer of territory, assets, liabilities, and 3 duties of the former Cuadrilla Improvement Corporation to the Lower Valley Water District. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act: 6 (1)"Commission" means the Texas 7 Commission on Environmental Quality or, as appropriate, its predecessor, the 8 Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission. 9 (2) "Corporation" means the Cuadrilla Improvement 10 11 Corporation. 12 (3) "Authority" means the Lower Valley Water District. 13 SECTION 2. FINDINGS. (a) On July 8, 1992, the County of El 14 Paso, Texas, by and through the county judge of El Paso County, quitclaimed the county's right, title, and interest in and to the 15 property and any improvements to the property described by Section 16 3 of this Act, to the corporation by executing a quitclaim deed, 17 record number 009280, as recorded in the county records of El Paso 18 19 County. 20 (b) The El Paso Water Control and Improvement District No. 4 21 assumed the responsibilities as temporary manager of the corporation, including the provision of water and wastewater 22 23 services to customers of the corporation by emergency order issued by the commission on September 30, 1999, and confirmed by the 24

1 commission on October 27, 1999.

2 (c) The corporation was involuntarily dissolved by order of
3 the secretary of state on July 18, 2007.

4 (d) The El Paso Water Control and Improvement District No. 4 5 no longer wishes to continue providing service to the former corporation's customers, and the authority is willing to provide 6 and capable of providing that service and of assuming any other 7 8 duties of the former corporation, provided that the authority is granted any remaining assets of the former corporation, including 9 10 the real property and any improvements to the property described by Section 3 of this Act. 11

(e) The transfer of any remaining assets of the former corporation, including the real property and any improvements to the property described by Section 3 of this Act, serves a public purpose and benefits the land included in the transfer.

16 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 2, Chapter 780, Acts of the 17 69th Legislature, Regular Session, 1985, is amended by adding 18 Subsection (c) to read as follows:

(c) In addition to the territory described by Subsection (a)
 of this section, the authority includes all of the property and any
 improvements to the property contained in the following area:

3 SECTION 4. TRANSFER OF ASSETS AND RESPONSIBILITIES. On the 4 effective date of this Act, the authority shall assume:

5 (1) from the El Paso Water Control and Improvement 6 District No. 4, the responsibility of providing water and 7 wastewater services to the customers in the service area of the 8 former corporation; and

9 (2) the powers, duties, liabilities, and remaining 10 assets of the former corporation, including the property described 11 by Section 3 of this Act.

12 SECTION 5. FINDINGS RELATED TO PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS. 13 (a) The legal notice of the intention to introduce this Act, 14 setting forth the general substance of this Act, has been published 15 as provided by law, and the notice and a copy of this Act have been 16 furnished to all persons, agencies, officials, or entities to which 17 they are required to be furnished under Section 59, Article XVI, 18 Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313, Government Code.

(b) The governor, one of the required recipients, hassubmitted the notice and Act to the commission.

(c) The commission has filed its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives within the required time.

(d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
and accomplished.

4

1 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 2 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 3 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 4 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 5 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
