1 WHEREAS, Raleigh K. Roussell retired as president and CEO of 2 TEXO in December 2012, concluding an exceptional career in the 3 commercial building industry that spanned nearly half a century; 4 and

5 WHEREAS, Mr. Roussell served for more than four decades with 6 TEXO, today the largest commercial contractors association in Texas 7 and one of the largest groups affiliated with the national 8 Associated Builders and Contractors and The Associated General 9 Contractors of America; and

WHEREAS, Early in his career, from 1968 to 1971, Mr. Roussell 10 11 served on the staff of the Dallas chapter of the Associated General 12 Contractors; after leaving for a time to work for one of the organization's members, he returned to lead the Dallas AGC in 1976; 13 14 over the ensuing years, he continued to guide the staff as the Dallas AGC merged with the Fort Worth AGC and then, in 2009, as that 15 16 organization joined with the North Texas chapter of Associated Builders and Contractors to form TEXO; and 17

18 WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan has received a number of honors 19 for his outstanding work in behalf of his industry, including 20 induction into the Contractors Hall of Fame at Texas A&M University 21 and designation as an Honorary Life Member of the American 22 Institute of Architects; he has also earned the SIR Award from the 23 Associated General Contractors, the Industry Lifetime Achievement 24 Award from the Associated Schools of Construction, and the

1 Chairman's Award from the Black Contractors Association; and

WHEREAS, Active in his community as well, Mr. Roussell has 2 3 contributed to area development as a member of the Dallas 2000 Planning Committee and the Mayor's Task Force on Downtown Dallas; 4 5 his involvement with the Dallas Youth Services Corps Board, Juvenile Diabetes Foundation, American Heart Association, and 6 Spring Valley Athletic Association has touched many lives, and he 7 8 has further given back as a member of the Texas A&M University Board of Visitors and Custer Road United Methodist Church in Plano; and 9

10 WHEREAS, Mr. Roussell has been blessed with the support of a 11 loving family, which includes his wife of 48 years, Judith Hermann 12 Roussell, his two children, and his five grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Raleigh Roussell has made an immeasurable contribution to the commercial building industry in Texas, and he may reflect with justifiable pride on his many accomplishments as he looks forward to the next chapter of his life; now, therefore, be it
