CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, For more than two decades, the Honorable Oscar O.
2 Martinez has served with distinction as a justice of the peace in
3 Webb County, and it is indeed fitting to name the Precinct 4 court
4 building in his honor; and

5 WHEREAS, Judge Martinez was elected as justice of the peace
6 for Precinct 4, Place 1, in 1991; during his tenure, he has worked
7 diligently to combat truancy and disciplinary problems, and, in
8 conjunction with the United States Border Patrol, he leads a new
9 program for at-risk youth; he has been recognized on numerous
10 occasions by the United Independent School District and other local
11 agencies for his commitment to improving the lives of area
12 students; and

13 WHEREAS, Active in a number of professional organizations,
14 Judge Martinez has served as director of the South Texas Justice of
15 the Peace and Constable Association and was a founder of the Texas
16 Justice Court Judges Association; moreover, he has attended the
17 College of Justice Court Judges; and

18 WHEREAS, This notable Texan is a veteran of the United States
19 Air Force and an alumnus of Texas A&I University, and he is a
20 previous director of the Laredo International Fair & Exposition;

22 WHEREAS, Judge Martinez has greatly benefited the people of
23 Webb County through his exceptional public service and many
24 contributions to the community, and naming the Precinct 4 court

1 building for him would provide an appropriate tribute; now,
2 therefore, be it

3 RESOLVED, That the 83rd Legislature of the State of Texas
4 hereby urge the Webb County Commissioners Court to name the
5 Precinct 4 court building in honor of Judge Oscar O. Martinez; and,

8 copy of this resolution to the Webb County Commissioners Court.
