H.J.R. No. 41

A JOINT RESOLUTION

proposing a constitutional amendment to require the comptroller of public accounts to make a state revenue report after the first year of a state fiscal biennium and the governor to call a special session of the legislature if actual state revenue for that fiscal year was at least five percent more or five percent less than projected state revenue.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 49a(a), Article III, Texas Constitution,
is amended to read as follows:

It shall be the duty of the Comptroller of Public 10 (a) Accounts in advance of each Regular Session of the Legislature to 11 prepare and submit to the Governor and to the Legislature upon its 12 convening a statement under oath showing fully the financial 13 condition of the State Treasury at the close of the last fiscal 14 period and an estimate of the probable receipts and disbursements 15 16 for the then current fiscal year. There shall also be contained in said statement an itemized estimate of the anticipated revenue 17 based on the laws then in effect that will be received by and for the 18 State from all sources showing the fund accounts to be credited 19 during each fiscal year of the succeeding biennium and said 20 21 statement shall contain such other information as may be required by law. Supplemental statements shall be submitted at any Special 22 23 Session of the Legislature, and at such other times as may be necessary to show probable changes. Not later than September 10 of 24

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1 each even-numbered year, the Comptroller shall prepare and submit 2 to the Governor and the Legislature a statement under oath showing fully the condition of the State Treasury, including actual revenue 3 received by and for the State from all sources, during the first 4 year of the current fiscal biennium. 5 SECTION 2. Section 8, Article IV, Texas Constitution, is 6 7 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows: 8 (c) The Governor shall immediately convene the Legislature in special session if, according to the comptroller's statement 9 10 prepared immediately after the end of the first year of the current fiscal biennium under Section 49a, Article III, of this 11 12 constitution, actual revenue received by and for the state from all sources during that year was at least five percent more or five 13 percent less than the revenue that was anticipated by the 14 comptroller to be received for that fiscal year according to the 15 last statement submitted to the Governor and Legislature before the 16 17 beginning of that fiscal year under Section 49a, Article III. The Legislature may consider any state fiscal matter, including 18 19 appropriations or taxation, at that special session, and any other matter designated by proclamation of the Governor. A special 20 session convened under this subsection may not last longer than 14 21 22 days.

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SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 5, 2013. The ballot shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposition: "The constitutional amendment requiring the comptroller of public accounts to make state revenue projections

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1 after the first fiscal year of a state biennium and the governor to 2 call a special session of the legislature if actual state revenue 3 for that fiscal year was at least five percent more or five percent 4 less than projected state revenue."
