A JOINT RESOLUTION

proposing a constitutional amendment designating the sheriff as the
chief law enforcement officer of the county.

3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 23, Article 5, Texas Constitution, is 5 amended to read as follows:

6 Sec. 23. There shall be elected by the qualified voters of 7 each county a Sheriff, <u>who is the chief law enforcement officer of</u> 8 <u>the county</u>, who shall hold <u>the</u> [<u>his</u>] office for the term of four 9 years, whose duties, qualifications, perquisites, and fees of 10 office, shall be prescribed by the Legislature, and vacancies in 11 whose office shall be filled by the Commissioners Court until the 12 next general election.

13 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be 14 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 5, 2013. 15 The ballot shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the 16 proposition: "The constitutional amendment designating the 17 sheriff as the chief law enforcement officer of the county."
