RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Proud residents of Comal County are gathering in New
- 2 Braunfels on January 22, 2013, to celebrate the rededication of
- 3 their historic and newly renovated courthouse; and
- WHEREAS, The county's original courthouse was built in 1860,
- 5 but it had fallen into disrepair by 1897, when the county commission
- 6 hired James Riely Gordon to design a new one; a celebrated architect
- 7 of many Texas public buildings, Mr. Gordon crafted a courthouse in
- 8 the Romanesque style with rounded pavilion entrances at the four
- 9 corners as well as a central atrium for ventilation during the Texas
- 10 summers; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The cornerstone was laid in May 1898 containing,
- 12 among many other items, a copy of a Galveston newspaper, a history
- 13 of Comal County, a dance card, and beer bottle labels from the city
- 14 brewery; constructed of locally quarried limestone, the courthouse
- 15 was dedicated on January 22, 1899, with a ceremony featuring
- 16 performances by Schulz's Orchestra and the New Braunfels Men's
- 17 Singing Society; and
- WHEREAS, In 1931, a three-story jail and an extension of the
- 19 district courtroom designed by local architect Jeremiah Schmidt
- 20 were attached to the building, and in 1951, Mr. Schmidt designed a
- 21 further addition, a vault for the county clerk's records; the
- 22 courthouse was remodeled and rewired in 1966, when air-conditioning
- 23 and an elevator were installed, and there were further renovations
- 24 in 1987; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Under the leadership of the Comal County
- 2 Commissioners Court, the current \$8.6 million restoration project
- 3 began in the summer of 2011, when the 1931 and 1951 additions were
- 4 removed; the project's architects, Volz & Associates, along with
- 5 the Texas Historical Commission and RBR Construction, worked for
- 6 the next year and a half to restore the courthouse to its original
- 7 appearance while modernizing its electrical, communications,
- 8 plumbing, and air-conditioning systems; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Some original fixtures were returned to the
- 10 building, including an arch-top entrance window that had been
- 11 hanging in a local restaurant since 1977, as well as the original
- 12 judge's bench; 60 pieces of historic furniture were also returned
- 13 to the courthouse, and former fixtures that could not be located
- 14 were replicated, including a massive spiral staircase and 164
- 15 theater-style seats for the commissioners courtroom and the
- 16 first-floor meeting room; and
- WHEREAS, For more than a century, the Comal County Courthouse
- 18 has served not only as the seat of government, but as a record in
- 19 stone of the county's rich history and a monument to its people's
- 20 German heritage, and it is indeed a privilege to take special notice
- 21 of the rebirth of this splendid building; now, therefore, be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas
- 23 Legislature hereby commemorate the restoration and rededication of
- 24 the Comal County Courthouse and commend all those involved in the
- 25 project for their skill, commitment, and hard work; and, be it
