## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The National Institute on Drug Abuse, part of the 2 National Institutes of Health, has designated January 28 through 3 February 3, 2013, as National Drug Facts Week in order to educate 4 teens about substance abuse and addiction; and

5 WHEREAS, According to available figures, more than 10 percent of high school seniors admit to the nonmedical use of prescription 6 painkillers, while approximately one-third report having used 7 illicit drugs within the past year and more than 20 percent 8 9 acknowledge having smoked marijuana during the past month; while teens often lack accurate knowledge about drugs and their effects, 10 they are frequently exposed to myths about drugs and drug use by way 11 12 of television, movies, music, the Internet, and their peers; and

WHEREAS, National Drug Facts Week was launched in 2010 as an effort to help teens make informed and responsible choices by connecting them with credible health experts; at school assemblies and other community-based events across the country, students will be able to ask scientists questions about the health and behavioral effects of drug use, and they are also invited to organize drug awareness activities in their own neighborhoods; and
