11 WHEREAS, After a successful career at American Airlines, 12 Mrs. Olafsen retired in 1987, which allowed her additional time to devote to cultural activities; she became a charter member of the 13 14 Irving Community Theatre Guild in 1989, and she has provided thoughtful guidance to the organization in the capacities of vice 15 16 president, treasurer, board member, and co-chair of elegance and entertainment, as well as in her current role as president; 17 moreover, she played a vital part in planning the shows Encore I, 18 Encore II, and An Evening with Louise Mandrell, and she has thrice 19 20 served as co-chair of the Mardi Gras Party, an event for which she 21 and her second husband, William Olafsen, were selected as king and queen in 2008; in recognition of her work, the guild honored her 22 23 with its Star Award in 2004; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Olafsen's enthusiasm and determination have

1 also been of great assistance to the Irving Symphony League; she served with that group from 1990 until 2009 and was co-chair for 2 3 three ISL balls; this gifted organizer oversaw registration for the 2002 conference of the Texas Association for Symphony Orchestras, 4 just one of many sterling contributions that garnered her the 5 league's Distinguished Service Award; for many of these projects, 6 as well as for the events she arranged for the Irving Community 7 8 Theatre Guild, she received vital help from Mr. Olafsen, her daughters Donna and Denise, and her son-in-law John Femrite; and 9
