5 WHEREAS, Court appointed special advocates are individuals

6 who speak up for children removed from their homes due to abuse or

7 neglect; sworn in by judges, CASA volunteers make certain that

8 these young people have a voice in the family court, social service,

9 and foster care systems, and the advocates remain focused on each

10 child until he or she is placed in a safe, permanent home and the

11 case is closed; often, the volunteers are a rare source of stability

12 in the lives of the young people they assist; and

WHEREAS, The CASA movement began in Seattle in 1977, when a

judge realized that he needed to know more about the young victims

15 of abuse and neglect who appeared in his courtroom; the

16 contributions of the volunteers who responded to his request for

17 assistance were so valuable that the program quickly spread to

18 other states; the first CASA program in Texas began in 1979, and

19 there are currently 69 local programs in the state that together

20 provide life-changing advocacy to more than half of the children in

21 the foster care system; and

22 WHEREAS, A diverse group that comes from a broad range of

23 backgrounds, CASA volunteers in Texas research a child's situation,

24 offer information and recommendations about the individual's best

- 2 "forever family"; in 2012, more than 7,200 volunteers gave help and
- 3 hope to more than 22,900 children; and

- 6 that a most vulnerable group in our society is not forgotten; now,
