RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Williams syndrome affects as many as 30,000 people
- 2 across the United States; and
- 3 WHEREAS, A developmental disorder, Williams syndrome is
- 4 characterized by mild to moderate intellectual disability or
- 5 learning problems, unique personality characteristics, distinctive
- 6 facial features, and cardiovascular problems; it is caused by the
- 7 deletion of genetic material from a specific region of chromosome
- 8 7; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Individuals with the syndrome tend to be outgoing
- 10 and take a great interest in other people; they may demonstrate
- 11 strengths in some intellectual areas, such as speech, long-term
- 12 memory, musical ability, and social skills, while showing weakness
- 13 in others, and they are prone to attention deficit disorder,
- 14 anxiety issues, or phobias; and
- WHEREAS, Frequently, WS brings a form of cardiovascular
- 16 disease, supravalvular aortic stenosis, that can become
- 17 life-threatening if left untreated; children with the syndrome may
- 18 need costly and ongoing medical care, and personalized educational
- 19 programs are generally indicated; and
- WHEREAS, Struggles with spatial relations, numbers, and
- 21 abstract reasoning can make daily tasks challenging, and as adults,
- 22 a high percentage of people with WS require supportive housing;
- 23 most lead healthy, full, and active lives, contributing to their
- 24 communities as volunteers or through employment, but it is vital

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- 1 that they receive ongoing medical monitoring and supervision to
- 2 detect medical problems that may develop over time; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Through appropriate care, education, and support,
- 4 individuals with Williams syndrome can reach their highest
- 5 potential, and early diagnosis greatly increases opportunities to
- 6 address health issues as they arise and help children grow to become
- 7 happy, productive citizens of the Lone Star State; now, therefore,
- 8 be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas
- 10 Legislature hereby encourage greater awareness of Williams
- 11 syndrome and call on all Texans to learn more about this condition.
