1 WHEREAS, A full and generous life drew to a close with the 2 passing of Edmond John Ford, Jr., of Corpus Christi on January 21, 3 2013, at the age of 94; and

WHEREAS, Born in Lawrence, Massachusetts, on January 28, 1918, Ed Ford was the son of Edmond and Grace Ford; he was a standout track and field athlete at Phillips Academy in Andover, and his strong academic record earned him acceptance to Harvard University, where he played for the football team and graduated cum laude; and

9 WHEREAS, In 1942, he exchanged vows with the former Marie 10 Roberta "Bobbe" Welder; after Mr. Ford earned his law degree from 11 Harvard, he and his wife relocated to her family's ranch north of 12 Taft, Texas, which he later operated; together for seven decades, 13 they were blessed with two daughters, Helen and Grace, and with the 14 passing years, they had the pleasure of seeing their family grow to 15 include 10 grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren; and

16 WHEREAS, Mr. Ford proudly served his country as a captain in the U.S. Army from 1942 until 1945, during which time he trained 17 pilots and established flight instrument courses in Bryan and 18 Lubbock; after the war, he began his career in law, specializing in 19 real estate, oil, and business deals, and served as a judge in the 20 21 early 1960s; a prominent community leader, he co-chartered the Bank of Corpus Christi, which later became IBC Bank, and served as its 22 23 chair; he also served as president of the Corpus Christi Country 24 Club, the Corpus Christi Town Club, and the Corpus Christi Pops

Concert Association and as vice president of the Corpus Christi
Symphony Society; and

13 WHEREAS, Known for his integrity, generosity, and devotion to 14 his family, Ed Ford leaves behind a legacy that will forever be 15 treasured by all who were fortunate to know him; now, therefore, be 16 it
