RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Residents of McAllen are gathering at the State 2 Capitol on February 5, 2013, to celebrate their community's 3 contributions to the vitality of the Lone Star State; and

WHEREAS, The development of present-day McAllen began in 1797 when Spanish settler Jose Manuel Gomez founded the Santa Anita Ranch in what is now southern Hidalgo County; the ranch grew in size and was eventually inherited by Mr. Gomez's great-granddaughter, Salome Balli, who married John McAllen; together they continued to add to the property and renamed it McAllen Ranch; and

WHEREAS, In 1904, the St. Louis, Brownsville, and Mexico Railroad arrived, and that same year, Mr. McAllen and other early settlers established the McAllen Townsite Company, along with a community named for John McAllen; other developers founded East McAllen in 1907, and the two towns eventually merged and became home to several businesses, churches, residences, and a newspaper; by 1920, the city was home to some 6,000 residents; and

WHEREAS, Over the last four decades, McAllen has grown into a 17 center for business, commerce, and government in the Rio Grande 18 Valley, and it is part of one of the fastest-growing metropolitan 19 20 statistical areas in the country; in 2012, Forbes magazine ranked 21 McAllen as one of the top three mid-sized cities in the nation for jobs; CNNMoney.com has listed McAllen as one of the fastest-growing 22 23 U.S. cities, and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics ranked the city number one for job growth for 2012; such designations continue a 24

1 trend of recognition for McAllen dating back to at least 1996, when
2 it was named an All-America City; and

WHEREAS, A vibrant cultural center, McAllen is home to the 3 International Museum of Art and Science, which serves as a showcase 4 5 for traveling exhibitions, loaned works from the Smithsonian Institution, and an extensive collection of Latin American folk 6 art; the city's newly created Arts District holds regular art 7 8 walks, drawing thousands of art enthusiasts monthly; McAllen is also a regional hub for banking, shopping, and conventions, thanks 9 10 to La Plaza Mall and a \$75 million convention center; moreover, the recently completed 123,000-square-foot new Main Library is one of 11 12 the largest single-floor public libraries in the nation; and

WHEREAS, Visitors and residents alike enjoy such festive annual events as the Candlelight Posada, the Fourth of July Celebration, and PalmFest, and in 2012, the city celebrated its fifth annual New Year's Eve bash, a free, community-wide event; and

WHEREAS, During 2013, the citizens of McAllen are celebrating the city's 102nd anniversary as a municipality, and they may indeed take great pride in their city, which has played a significant role in the annals of Texas history; now, therefore, be it
