WHEREAS, This worthy tradition dates to the 1940s, when Arkansas educator Mattye Whyte Woodridge began corresponding with political and educational leaders to suggest an official day to honor teachers across the country; her efforts attracted the attention of Eleanor Roosevelt, who in 1953 persuaded the United States Congress to proclaim a National Teacher Day; the event is now observed on the Tuesday of the first full week of May; and
