1 WHEREAS, With the passing of Joe Clifton Moseley II of

2 Rockport on November 25, 2012, the State of Texas lost an admired

3 and knowledgeable authority on coastal, environmental, and

4 transportation issues; and

5 WHEREAS, A native of Fort Worth, Joe Moseley was born on

6 October 21, 1944, and grew up in Joshua; he graduated with a

7 bachelor's degree in civil engineering from Texas A&M University

8 and went on to earn a master's degree in environmental health and a

9 doctorate in civil engineering from The University of Texas at

10 Austin, and his dissertation was honored as the best produced at UT

11 in 1973; and

12 WHEREAS, Dr. Moseley began his career as a water systems

13 engineer with the Texas Water Development Board, and he joined the

14 governor's staff for natural resource programs in 1970; two years

15 later, he was appointed executive director of the Texas Coastal and

16 Marine Council and subsequently held the post of deputy general

17 manager of the Texas Deepwater Port Authority; during his time in

18 these positions, he managed dozens of special studies for the

19 governor's office and the Texas Legislature on subjects such as

20 fisheries, marine transportation, disaster planning, and tourism,

21 and he oversaw the development of a comprehensive coastal resource

22 management plan; moreover, he often traveled to Washington, D.C.,

23 where he was a member of several national advisory committees on

24 offshore petroleum and coastal management; and

- 1 WHEREAS, In 1980, Dr. Moseley left the public sector to work manager of business development and vice president 2 as engineering for the Goldstone Corporation, and five years later, he 3 cofounded Shiner Moseley and Associates, Inc., in Corpus Christi; 4 he was a principal partner in the firm until 2005, when it was 5 acquired by HDR Engineering, and he continued to serve as a 6 consultant for the company until his retirement from the business 7
- 9 WHEREAS, Highly respected by his peers, Dr. Moseley was 10 selected as the 2007 recipient of the Morrough P. O'Brien Award from the American Shore and Beach Preservation Association for his 11 12 lifetime achievements in conservation and environmental 13 stewardship; his expertise was further recognized with his 14 gubernatorial appointment to the inaugural management committee of 15 the Corpus Christi Bay National Estuary Program; and

- 16 WHEREAS, Dr. Moseley played a prominent role in various 17 business, civic, and educational organizations as well; his accomplishments include serving as director of the Texas Chamber of 18 Commerce and as chair of the board of managers of Memorial Medical 19 Center, and he also taught as an adjunct professor at Texas A&M 20 University--Corpus Christi for nearly two decades; in his free 21 time, he enjoyed hunting, fishing, boating, spending time with his 22 23 family, and traveling with his wife, Karen; and
- 24 WHEREAS, With his broad range of expertise, Joe Moseley made 25 a positive difference in numerous fields of endeavor, and his 26 achievements will continue to resonate in the Lone Star State and 27 beyond for many years to come; now, therefore, be it
