- 1 WHEREAS, Family, friends, and newspaper readers around the 2 state are mourning the death of longtime journalist and publisher Bert C. West of Palacios, who passed away on January 24, 2013, at 3 the age of 86; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Born in Indiana on October 28, 1926, Bert West began his long and distinguished career in 1947, writing for harness 6 7 racing magazines in Indianapolis, and he took his first newspaper job as a sports reporter five years later; over a career that would 8 9 span more than six decades, he engaged in every facet of the
- 11 publisher; working primarily in Texas since his move here in 1954,

- 12 he contributed to more than 20 dailies and weeklies across the
- 13 state; and

- 14 WHEREAS, Mr. West worked mostly at small papers, covering the
- 15 news in communities such as Stephenville, El Campo, Port Lavaca,
- 16 Vernon, Bay City, San Benito, Littlefield, Pasadena, Dumas, Bogata,
- 17 and Yoakum; in 1968, he accepted an offer from the ${\it Houston\ Chronicle}$
- 18 to manage its bureau at the Manned Spacecraft Center, and he covered
- 19 the first moon landing for the paper; he also acted as the space
- 20 center correspondent for Newsday and three international news
- 21 agencies; in 1999, he joined the staff of the Palacios Beacon,
- 22 serving as editor for the last decade of his professional life and
- 23 working alongside a son and grandson; and
- 24 WHEREAS, A talented and persuasive reporter, Mr. West was the

- 1 lead correspondent on a lengthy series in St. Louis that was
- 2 instrumental in the city's maintaining its airport in Missouri
- 3 rather than investing in a new facility in Illinois, and he penned a
- 4 succession of articles that helped keep a TxDOT district office
- 5 open in Yoakum; his coverage of the Kentucky Derby in the early
- 6 1950s earned him a commendation from the Associated Press, and his
- 7 colleagues in the Texas Press Association bestowed on him the
- 8 Golden 50 Award for his years of exemplary service; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Mr. West joined enthusiastically in the life of the
- 10 communities where he worked; he founded youth sports programs in
- 11 Stephenville and El Campo and started fishing tournaments in Port
- 12 Lavaca and Palacios; he was the director of the Yoakum Hospital
- 13 District and the president of the Calhoun County Fair; he also
- 14 joined numerous local Jaycee, Rotary, and Optimist clubs and served
- 15 on a number of library boards; in Palacios, he was director of the
- 16 chamber of commerce and a member of the Centennial Committee, and he
- 17 was elected to the city council, which he further served as mayor
- 18 pro tem; and
- WHEREAS, Throughout his endeavors, Mr. West enjoyed the love
- 20 and support of his wife, Betty Lou, with whom he shared 64 years,
- 21 before she passed away in 2012; he took great pride in a treasured
- 22 family that grew to include 8 children, 22 grandchildren, and 22
- 23 great-grandchildren; and
- 24 WHEREAS, This veteran, old-school journalist will be
- 25 remembered for his longstanding commitment to informing and
- 26 enlightening his fellow citizens and for the many contributions he
- 27 made to the communities in which he lived; now, therefore, be it
