RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Nearly a quarter of a century before the siege of the

2 Alamo, an army inspired by the fervor of Don Jose Bernardo Maximiliano Gutierrez de Lara and composed of Tejanos, volunteers 3 from the United States, and Native American allies made a 4 courageous bid to liberate Texas from the Spanish empire, leading 5 to the first Texas Declaration of Independence on April 6, 1813; and 6 7 WHEREAS, On September 16, 1810, Father Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla and his followers seized the prison at Dolores, Mexico, 8 9 sparking a Mexican rebellion against the Spanish empire; answering the call to freedom, Don Bernardo traveled to Washington, D.C., in 10 11 1811 to inform the U.S. government of the rebels' plans to establish 12 a republican government in Texas as part of the liberation of Mexico; and 13 14 WHEREAS, In 1812, Don Bernardo and former U.S. Army officer Augustus Magee led the Army of the North from Nachitoches, 15 Louisiana, into Texas; this volunteer force quickly defeated the 16 Spanish Royalist troops at the Battles of Nacogdoches, La Bahia, 17 Rosillo, and Alazan Creek; and 18 WHEREAS, Don Bernardo and the republican army took possession 19 20 of San Fernando de Bexar, now known as San Antonio, on the night of 21 April 1 and 2, 1813, and on April 6, 1813, Don Bernardo signed a proclamation declaring Texas' independence from Spain; on April 17, 22 23 1813, acting in his capacity as president of the new provisional government, Don Bernardo signed the first Texas Constitution; and 24

- 1 WHEREAS, This first bold attempt to win the independence of
- 2 Texas came to a tragic end on August 18, 1813, when the Royalist
- 3 army under General Joaquin de Arredondo defeated the Texan army at
- 4 the Battle of Medina; during the bitterly fought, four-hour-long
- 5 contest, more than 800 Tejano patriots lost their lives in their
- 6 quest for freedom; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The valiant struggle of Don Jose Bernardo
- 8 Maximiliano Gutierrez de Lara and the Army of the North to throw off
- 9 the Spanish yoke represents a significant chapter in the rich
- 10 annals of Texas history, one that is indeed worthy of remembrance on
- 11 this special occasion; now, therefore, be it
- 12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas
- 13 Legislature hereby commemorate the 200th anniversary of the first
- 14 Texas Declaration of Independence on April 6, 2013, and call on all
- 15 Texans to honor the memory of Don Bernardo and his comrades.
