5 WHEREAS, In 1997, Mr. Scott was himself the victim of an 6 erroneous eyewitness identification, the most common cause of false 7 convictions; he served more than 12 years of a life sentence before 8 he was exonerated; and

9 WHEREAS, Mr. Scott, a business owner and father of two, has 10 now dedicated himself to assisting prisoners with compelling claims of innocence; he founded a nonprofit organization, House of Renewed 11 12 Hope, and obtained a private investigator's license to facilitate obtaining court records and visiting inmates; working with a team 13 of fellow exonerees, he not only pursues cases but also engages in 14 public education, raises funds for services such as DNA testing, 15 16 and strongly advocates for reform of the criminal justice system; in addition, his organization reaches out to newly released 17 exonerees, offering support for the transition to a new life; and 18

WHEREAS, Through his selfless endeavors, Christopher Scott is providing hope to the wrongfully incarcerated and advancing the cause of social justice, and he is an inspiration to all who know him; now, therefore, be it
