1 WHEREAS, Friends and family are mourning the loss of Robert 2 H. Korman of Arlington, who passed away on March 30, 2012, at the 3 age of 90; and

WHEREAS, A native of Chicago, Bob Korman was born on May 17, 1921, to Stella and Henry Korman; he attended the University of Idaho, joining the Delta Tau Delta Fraternity, but interrupted his education to enlist in the U.S. Army in 1942; he subsequently served in the infantry for three years, with much of that time spent in the Pacific theater; at the war's conclusion, he returned to Chicago and joined the Illinois National Guard; and

11 WHEREAS, Mr. Korman met his future wife, Dorothy Johnson, 12 through his sister, and the couple were married in 1947; they moved Indianapolis in 1953, and Mr. Korman became 13 to а sales 14 representative for RTE Corporation and also joined the Indiana National Guard; he went on to graduate from the Army Command and 15 General Staff College and the Industrial College of the Armed 16 Forces, and by the time he retired from the National Guard in 1970, 17 he had attained the rank of colonel; and 18

WHEREAS, That same year, Mr. Korman accepted a promotion as regional sales manager with RTE and moved to Arlington; he retired from the corporation in 1986 and turned his energies to civic and community organizations; he served as a member of the board of directors of the Tarrant County Citizens Crime Commission, as a member of the New Visions and Strategic Planning Committees of the

1 Arlington Independent School District, and as president of the 2 Arlington Senior Men's Club; in addition, he was actively involved 3 with the Arlington Parks and Recreation Board for many years, 4 including serving as chair, and he participated at the local, 5 state, and national levels of the American Diabetes Association; 6 and

7 WHEREAS, Mr. Korman enjoyed worship and fellowship at Lake 8 Arlington Baptist Church, where he taught Sunday school and served on the church's finance board; devoted to his family, he shared 59 9 10 years with his wife, who preceded him in death in 2007, and he was the proud father of three children, Dian, Donna, and Bob; moreover, 11 12 he experienced the delight of welcoming two grandsons, Travis and 13 Zachary, into his life; among those closest to him he was known for 14 his sense of humor and love of practical jokes, and he was often 15 heard laughing; and

16 WHEREAS, Bob Korman was a true asset to his country, his 17 community, and his family, and although he will be deeply missed, 18 cherished memories of time spent in his company will long endure in 19 the hearts of all those who were privileged to know him; now, 20 therefore, be it
