RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Proud residents of Burleson County are gathering in 2 Austin on March 26, 2013, to celebrate the unique role their county has played in the history and culture of the Lone Star State; and 3 WHEREAS, Situated among rolling hills and along the broad 4 5 valley of the Brazos River, the rich farmland of Burleson County was originally inhabited by the Tonkawa Indians; the first European to 6 7 visit the region was the French explorer and trader Louis Juchereau de St. Denis; when Anglo-Americans started to settle there during 8 9 the 1820s, the Mexican government placed a fort along the western bank of the Brazos to stem the tide, but the fort's commander, 10 11 Lieutenant Colonel Jose Francisco Ruiz, eventually sided with the 12 Texans and became a signer of the Texas Declaration οf Independence; and 13 14 WHEREAS, The town of Caldwell was founded in 1840, and in 1846, the state legislature established Burleson County, naming it 15 16 after Texas revolutionary hero General Edward Burleson and choosing Caldwell as the county seat; during the last half of the 19th 17 century, European immigrants, especially Germans, Austrians, 18 Czechs, and Italians, moved to the area and often set up their own 19 20 communities; and 21 WHEREAS, Burleson County is situated along the Presidential Corridor linking the LBJ Presidential Library in Austin and the 22 23 George Bush Presidential Library and Museum in College Station;

- 10 the county's Czech heritage at the Kolache Festival, held every
- 11 September in Caldwell, which was proclaimed the Kolache Capital of
- 12 Texas by the Texas Legislature in 1989; and
- WHEREAS, The county's history is on display at the Kraitchar
- 14 House Museum, the Somerville Area Museum, the Burleson County Czech
- 15 Heritage Museum, the Caldwell Visitors Center Museum, and the
- 16 Burleson County Historical Museum, and throughout the county are 66
- 17 historical markers and 120 historic cemeteries; there are also the
- 18 opportunities for recreation afforded by Davidson Creek Park in
- 19 Caldwell and the city parks in Somerville and Snook; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Honoring the past as they continue to work toward a
- 21 brighter future, the residents of Burleson County have many reasons
- 22 to be proud of the place they call home; now, therefore, be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas
- 24 Legislature hereby recognize March 26, 2013, as Burleson County Day
- 25 at the State Capitol and extend to the visiting delegation sincere
- 26 best wishes for an enjoyable and memorable stay in Austin.
