from Central High School and completed her bachelor's degree in 6

7 English at The University of Texas at Austin; at a dance in her

hometown, she met a Wichita Falls oilman, Perry Bass, and they 8

married in 1941 at the First Methodist Church of Fort Worth; and 9

WHEREAS, Mrs. Bass was the devoted mother of four sons, Sid, 10

Ed, Bob, and Lee, and she eventually knew the joy of welcoming 10 11

grandchildren and 7 great-grandchildren into her cherished family; 12

she and her husband shared a rewarding relationship of 65 years 13

before his passing in 2006; and 14

WHEREAS, Deeply committed to civic life, Mrs. Bass gave 15

16 generously of her time and talents in myriad leadership roles; she

served for three decades as a vice president and a director of the

Sid W. Richardson Foundation, and she was a member of the boards of 18

numerous local, state, and national organizations, among them the 19

of the National Gallery of Art, and the Modern Art Museum of Fort 21

Worth; in addition, she served on the advisory board of the Van 22

- 2 Club; a woman of faith, she belonged to the First United Methodist
- 3 Church for many years; and
- WHEREAS, A tireless benefactor of the arts, education, human
- 5 services, and health care, Mrs. Bass chose to celebrate her 50th
- 6 wedding anniversary by joining with her husband to give \$1 million
- 7 each to 50 charitable institutions; and
- 8 WHEREAS, She sought to avoid the limelight, but her
- 9 leadership and generosity in cultural and civic affairs brought her
- 10 a host of accolades, including the Distinguished Alumna Award from
- 11 The University of Texas Ex-Students' Association, the Golden Deeds
- 12 Award from the Exchange Club of Fort Worth, and the inaugural Gloria
- 13 Lupton Tennison Pioneer Award from the National Cowgirl Museum and
- 14 Hall of Fame; in 1998, the Nancy Lee and Perry R. Bass Performance
- 15 Hall was named in honor of Mr. and Mrs. Bass at the suggestion of
- 16 renowned pianist Van Cliburn; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Nancy Lee Bass was truly the "first lady of Fort
- 18 Worth," and those who were privileged to know her will forever
- 19 remember her exceptional kindness, wisdom, and grace; now,
