## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, In March of 2010, the United States Congress enacted 2 the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act to address the 3 nation's urgent health care crisis; and WHEREAS, Before passage of the Affordable Care Act, the \$2.5 4 5 trillion health care industry accounted for about 17 percent of U.S. gross domestic product but left tens of millions of Americans 6 7 uninsured; many who were excluded from insurance coverage eventually consumed health care services for which others paid, 8

9 since our law and culture do not permit hospitals to turn away

10 people in need of emergency treatment; each year, some \$73 billion

11 in costs for uninsured patients was shifted to others, raising the

12 average family's annual insurance premium by about \$1,000 and

13 increasing the burden on taxpayers by at least \$30 billion; and

WHEREAS, After extensive study, Congress passed the
Affordable Care Act, and on March 23, 2010, President Obama signed

16 it into law; the ACA builds on the existing nationwide system of

17 employer-based health insurance and expands Medicaid eligibility

18 to those with incomes below 1-1/3 times the federal poverty level,

19 among other measures; the act is expected to extend care to more

20 than 30 million previously uninsured Americans; and

21 WHEREAS, Opponents almost immediately began working to undo

22 the law in Congress or the courts; in 2011, the Supreme Court agreed

23 to hear a challenge to the Affordable Care Act, centering on the

24 question of whether Congress has the constitutional power to

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- 1 require people to purchase health insurance or face a penalty
- 2 through the so-called "individual mandate"; the court's landmark
- 3 decision of June 28, 2012, upheld the law, ruling that the financial
- 4 penalty might reasonably be characterized as a tax and that such a
- 5 tax is permitted under the constitution; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Supreme Court's ruling on the Patient Protection
- 7 and Affordable Care Act cleared the way for the United States to
- 8 proceed with implementing the law, and millions of Americans now
- 9 look forward to gaining health care coverage; now, therefore, be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas
- 11 Legislature hereby recognize that the Patient Protection and
- 12 Affordable Care Act was enacted by the United States Congress and
- 13 signed by the president of the United States, and it is now the law
- 14 of the land, as per the historic Supreme Court decision of June 28,
- 15 2012.
