RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Martha McLeod, a science teacher at Fulton Learning

2 Center, is being inducted into the National Teachers Hall of Fame on

3 April 9, 2013; and

4 WHEREAS, The National Teachers Hall of Fame was founded in

5 1989 to celebrate and encourage excellence in education and to

6 preserve the heritage of the teaching profession in the United

7 States; each year, five of the country's most outstanding career

8 teachers are selected for induction by a panel of Hall of Fame

9 members, representatives from educational organizations, and

10 business leaders; and

11 WHEREAS, Joining the ranks of these distinguished educators,

12 Ms. McLeod is a fourth- and fifth-grade science lab instructor who

13 has two decades of experience in the classroom, including nine

14 years with Fulton Learning Center; she is known for the dedication

15 and enthusiasm she brings to her work and for her immersion style of

16 teaching, which is designed to promote a deep understanding of

17 scientific concepts and a sense of responsibility for the natural

18 world; a leader among her colleagues, she also serves as the science

19 subject area coordinator, overseeing the training and operations of

20 the science department, in addition to developing and updating

21 curriculum; and

WHEREAS, Ms. McLeod has transformed the Fulton campus into a

23 hands-on learning environment, complete with multiple outdoor

24 classrooms and habitats where students can observe wildlife and

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- 1 grow their own vegetables; her efforts have earned the school
- 2 designation as a Certified Wildlife Habitat and an official Texas
- 3 Wildscape, and its grounds have become a destination in the
- 4 community's annual HummerBird Celebration tour; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Ms. McLeod's work to increase student engagement
- 6 further includes her creation of two poultry gardens, which allow
- 7 students the opportunity to harvest eggs and then sell them at the
- 8 farmers' market, and a campus-wide metal recycling project, which
- 9 has yielded more than 10,000 pounds of metal; moreover, she was
- 10 instrumental in organizing the school birding team, and she
- 11 established a junior docent program at the Aquarium at Rockport
- 12 Harbor; always looking for ways to make lessons relevant to
- 13 real-world contexts, she planned and implemented a comprehensive
- 14 unit on area wetlands, in which students observe and analyze how
- 15 water quality is affected by human activity; and
- WHEREAS, This remarkable educator has garnered both state and
- 17 national Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and
- 18 Science Teaching and was a state finalist for the H-E-B Excellence
- 19 in Education Teaching Award as well as the Texas Environmental
- 20 Excellence Award; most recently, she was chosen from more than 540
- 21 nominees to receive the 2013 Ernest and Sarah Butler Award for
- 22 Excellence in Science Teaching by the Texas Medical Association;

- WHEREAS, Martha McLeod's passion and innovation have opened
- 25 the minds of many young learners to the beauty and power of science,
- 26 and this prestigious recognition is indeed a fitting tribute to
- 27 this truly outstanding educator; now, therefore, be it

- 2 Legislature hereby congratulate Martha McLeod on her induction into
- 3 the National Teachers Hall of Fame and extend to her sincere best
