- 2 death of Edward Arnold Fulbright of Irving on March 9, 2013, at the
- 3 age of 82; and
- WHEREAS, The son of Finis Franklin Fulbright and Willie Mae
- 5 Monsey Fulbright, Ed Fulbright was born in Stamford and moved with
- 6 his family to Plano in 1945; there, he met his future wife, Betty Jo
- 7 Collinsworth, and the pair married in 1950 and then settled in
- 8 Irving; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Answering his country's call to duty, Mr. Fulbright
- 10 served in the United States Marine Corps; following his discharge,
- 11 he began his career at Grand Prairie State Bank, and in 1963, he
- 12 purchased Ed's Pawn Shop, which he operated with his wife until his
- 13 retirement in 1986; he also owned Ed's Marine Center and helped
- 14 others in the community to start their own businesses; and
- 15 WHEREAS, In addition to his entrepreneurial work,
- 16 Mr. Fulbright was involved in reserve law enforcement for
- 17 approximately 37 years; beginning with a decade at the Irving
- 18 Police Department, he then served 22 years as Dallas County deputy
- 19 constable and later acted as reserve deputy constable in Denton
- 20 County; he retired with the rank of lieutenant; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Mr. Fulbright was an active member of his community;
- 22 he enjoyed helping people with disabilities achieve independent
- 23 lifestyles through his work with the National American Business
- 24 Clubs; he served as president of its Irving chapter and as district

- 1 governor, and the organization recognized him with a number of
- 2 awards and a life membership; hosting many social events, he and
- 3 Mrs. Fulbright were known as part of the "Irving Rat Pack," and the
- 4 couple received Irving's High Spirited Citizens Award in 1999;
- 5 Mr. Fulbright was also a valued congregant of the South MacArthur
- 6 Church of Christ; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In his leisure time, he enjoyed hunting and
- 8 traveling the world with his wife, with whom he shared more than six
- 9 decades; he also took great pride in his children, Debra, David, and
- 10 Darryl, his seven grandchildren, and his six great-grandchildren;

- 12 WHEREAS, Deeply devoted to his family and his community, Ed
- 13 Fulbright made a meaningful difference in the lives of his loved
- 14 ones and fellow citizens alike, and his contributions will be
- 15 remembered for years to come; now, therefore, be it
