2 beloved El Paso educator and longtime basketball coach Alvis Reed

3 Glidewell, who won the admiration of many people over the course of

4 his lifetime with his kind and winning ways; and

5 WHEREAS, A native of Clovis, New Mexico, Alvis Glidewell

6 became interested in basketball during his youth after his dad put

7 up a hoop in the yard; he blossomed into a skilled athlete, and the

8 lean young man who was known as "Bones" led his Clovis High School

9 team to a state championship; he went on to play for Texas Western

10 College and was team captain in 1956 and 1957, when the Miners won

11 back-to-back Border Conference titles; and

12 WHEREAS, After serving in the U.S. Army, he embarked on a

13 successful high school coaching career in El Paso that spanned 29

14 years; he ably guided the teams at Austin and Irvin High Schools,

15 compiling a record of 570 wins and 323 losses and winning seven

16 district titles; his squads reached the state playoffs 11 times and

17 made the "Sweet 16" on three occasions; an excellent classroom

18 instructor as well, he taught mathematics and inspired his students

19 with his passion for the subject; and

20 WHEREAS, Renowned as a fierce competitor, Coach Glidewell

21 nonetheless possessed the qualities of a true sportsman, showing

respect for his opponents and demonstrating a humble attitude in

23 victory or defeat; the kindness he demonstrated toward everyone he

24 met earned him many admirers, and he was greeted with affectionate

- 2 WHEREAS, For his athletic achievements, Coach Glidewell was
- 3 inducted into the El Paso Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998, and he
- 4 later served as the president of the hall of fame and as a member of
- 5 the executive committee; in addition, he was honored during a UTEP
- 6 Legends halftime program in 2013; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, he enjoyed the love and
- 8 support of his wife, Martha, with whom he shared 47 years of
- 9 marriage and raised two daughters, Trisha and Lana; after his
- 10 retirement in 1994, he enjoyed traveling and attending UTEP dinner
- 11 theater performances with Mrs. Glidewell, but his competitive fires
- 12 continued to burn bright; he took up the game of bridge and was just
- 13 three points shy of Silver Life Master status at the time of his
- 14 death; and
- WHEREAS, An individual who enriched the lives of countless
- 16 people in his roles as a coach and teacher, Alvis Glidewell was
- 17 equally admired as a caring husband, father, and friend, and
- 18 memories of his warmth and generosity will forever remain a source
- 19 of inspiration for those who had the good fortune to know him; now,
- 20 therefore, be it
