13 WHEREAS, Officer Bryan M. Hebert of the Beaumont Police 14 Department earned the respect and admiration of his peers for his 15 commitment to serving the greater good, and his contributions will 16 not soon be forgotten; and

WHEREAS, Throughout his tenure, which spanned 10 years and 6 months, Officer Hebert demonstrated the loyalty, courage, and self-sacrifice that are consistent with the highest ideals of the law enforcement profession; and
