RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Members of the Tri-County Black Chamber of Commerce are gathering in Austin on April 30, 2013, to celebrate Tri-County Black Chamber of Commerce Day at the State Capitol; and

WHEREAS, A nonprofit organization with headquarters in Houston, the TCBCC works to promote the economic, civil, and social welfare of African American business owners and professionals; and

7 WHEREAS, Led by chair Doretta Fisher, president and CEO 8 Leondria Thompson, vice president A. Todd Jackson, secretary Diatra 9 James, treasurer Verna McCarthy, and directors Henry Mosley, Sherri 10 Gongara, Eugene Smith, and Marcial Orlando Felix, members of the 11 TCBCC represent small businesses, corporations, community and 12 professional associations, and other chambers of commerce; and

WHEREAS, Focusing on business education, advocacy, 13 and 14 development, the organization offers training sessions and workshops featuring discussions of best practices and strategies 15 16 for securing financing, stimulating job creation, and facilitating entry into the global marketplace; it also arranges town hall 17 meetings with elected officials and provides technical assistance 18 and venues for networking as additional benefits to membership; and 19

20 WHEREAS, The TCBCC was inspired by Booker T. Washington's 21 Negro Business League; established in 1900, the league advanced the 22 philosophy that independent business development was a condition 23 for economic cooperation, independence, and prosperity; Marcus 24 Garvey founded similar organizations in the early 20th century,

1 including the Universal Negro Improvement Association and the 2 African Communities League, which advocated that African Americans 3 should have the opportunity to legislate for their own common good; 4 Mr. Garvey spent much of his time and energy promoting trade and 5 commerce between Black people from the United States and Africa, 6 Central and South America, and the West Indies; and

7 WHEREAS, Following this distinguished legacy, the TCBCC's 8 most recent trade mission, held in Belize in March of 2013, brought together entrepreneurs and government officials to 9 explore 10 partnerships and export opportunities with Belize's Ministry of Energy, Science & Technology and Public Utilities; the TCBCC has a 11 12 similar business development mission planned for July and August 2013, when its members will visit Panama City, Panama, 13 and 14 Barranquilla, Colombia, to discuss how micro and small business 15 owners can benefit from U.S. free trade agreements; and

16 WHEREAS, By working to build a network of prosperous business 17 owners actively promoting global competitiveness, the Tri-County 18 Black Chamber of Commerce is benefiting countless people and is 19 making a noteworthy contribution to the prosperity of the Lone Star 20 State; now, therefore, be it

21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas 22 Legislature hereby recognize April 30, 2013, as Tri-County Black 23 Chamber of Commerce Day at the State Capitol and extend to the 24 organization's members sincere best wishes for continued success.
